## *History*

- **1930** – Founded as Norfolk Division of the College of William and Mary
- **1962** – Gained independent status as Old Dominion College
- **1969** – Granted university status



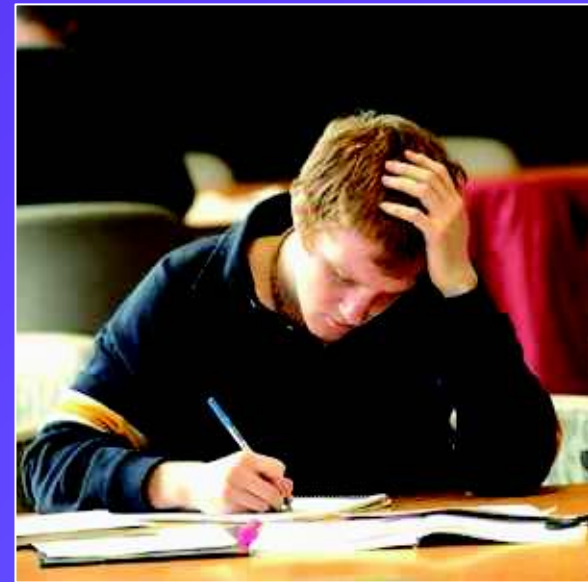
## *Enrollment (Fall 2006)*

- **More than 6,000 students live within walking distance of the Norfolk Campus**



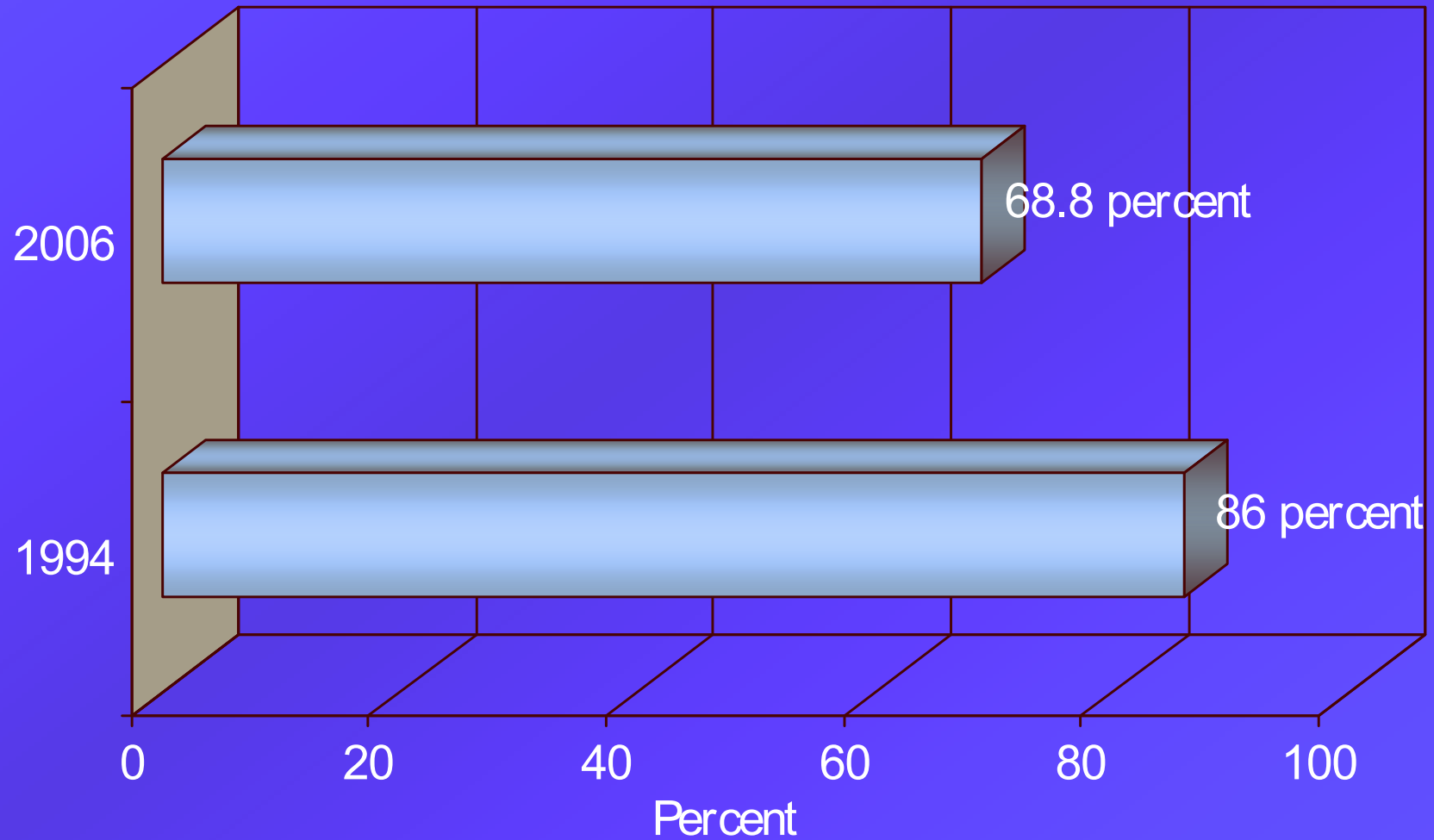
# *Admissions*

  - The number of transfer students enrolled was the second highest number since 1989



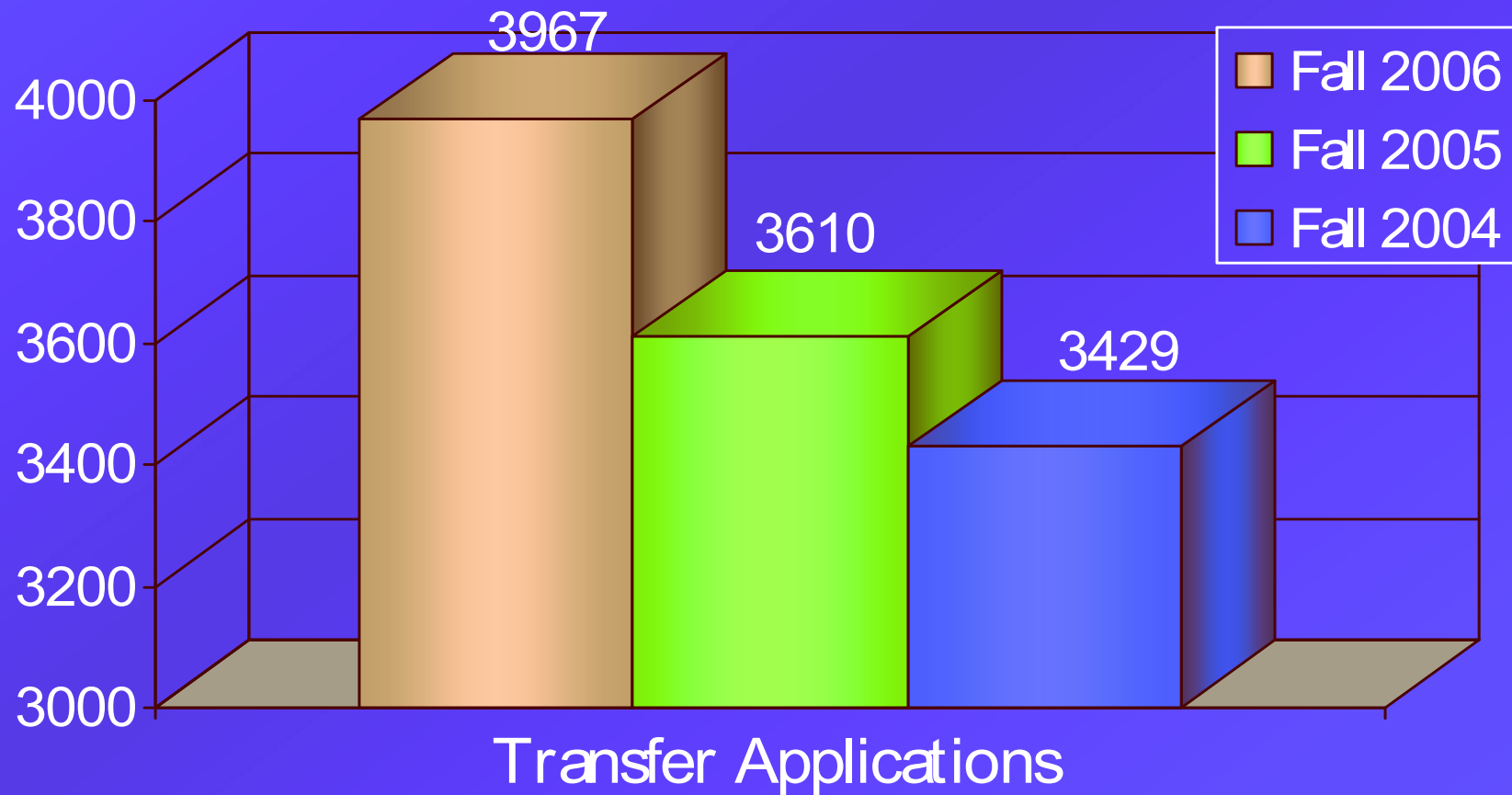

# *TELETECHNET*

- A total of 30 complete degree programs at the undergraduate and graduate level
- More than 350 courses provided annually for distance learning students at more than 50 sites in every corner of the Commonwealth
- **TELETECHNET** expects to record more than 26,000 registrations during this academic year
- Some 3,500 Virginians have already completed a degree program as a result of **TELETECHNET**
- Multiple modes of delivery are available for distance learners including satellite, Internet and CD-ROM
- Old Dominion's commitment to broadcast M.B.A. classes to Navy personnel deployed around the world has been featured in *The New York Times*, *The Chronicle of Higher Education* and *Business Week*
- The classes are offered at the same time every Sunday to the ship, regardless of location
